

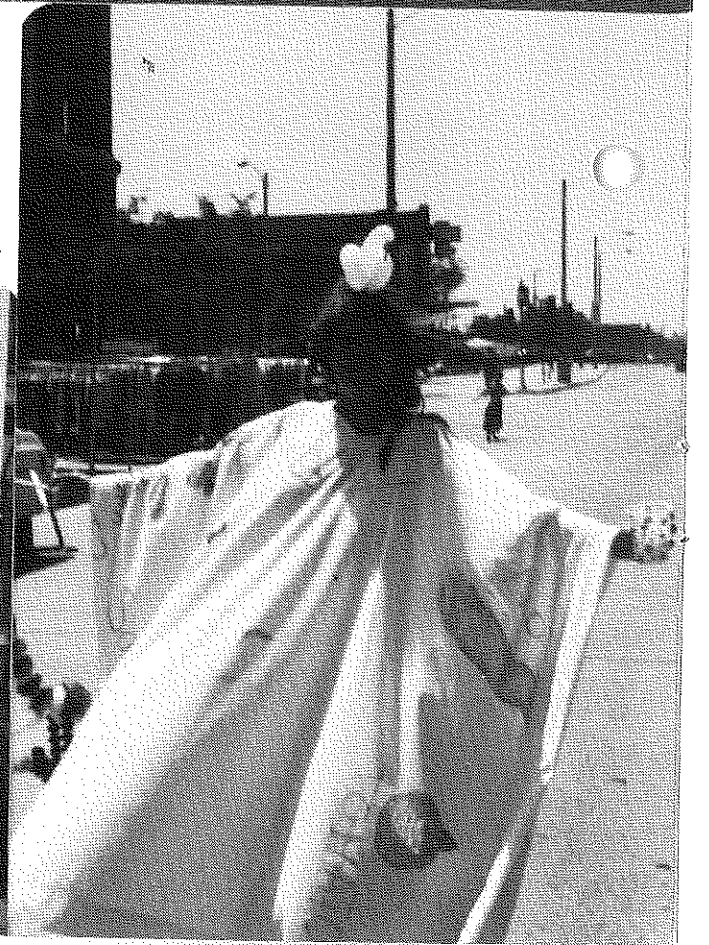

## WE ARE BECAUSE OF YOU

"My Community Health Center is the place I can go to learn and begin to feel good about myself. It's just around the corner. The cost won't be very high. I trust the people there because they care about me and they know that's what I want".

There are seven Community Health Centers in the Greater Milwaukee area. They provide a range of health care and education services to all persons facing problems of entry into the more traditional health care structures. During 1977, (3) more Health Centers opened their doors to the Community for the first time. At the same time two other Centers are turning the calendar to 10 years of service, 16th St. Community Health Center being one of these Centers. And, the numbers of persons being seen at all Centers continues to grow with only the limitations of resources on the part of Centers temporarily prohibiting a greater increase in service capacity.

1977 saw the gathering together of representatives from each Center. Their purpose was to join hands in mutual support recognizing that together, a significant role is played in the delivery of health care and educational services to the Milwaukee area. Also acknowledged however, was the growing need of support in the form of resources, especially if Community Health Centers are to continue to serve. Community Health Centers do need the support of the Milwaukee Community; as strong a support as that of the Community members who put together the limited resources to get everyone started in the first place. The real message then is to encourage you to get to know your Community Health Center - help it - support it.

# Self-Help Urged for Health

Patient, heal thyself. That was the advice handed out Monday night on the possibility of reform and, to some measure, control of the present centralized system of medical care.

The advice perhaps was summed up best not by any of the five panelists who spoke at the University of Wisconsin — Milwaukee, but by a young woman in the audience. "At the turn of the century," she told the panel of officials of community or grass roots health organizations, "people knew everything they could to take care of themselves. Somehow we have lost control of that."

No one suggested that the nation return to turn of the century health standards. But they did decry a medical system in which citizens are too dependent on institutions and practitioners for a sense of well-being, believe that when they get sick no money should be spent on their care.

If you have a body is no different from any other body. You have the same rights as a consumer. You have the right to know what you are getting, to make choices, to make decisions.

...rate at which another disease, herpes, is spreading," she said. "It's lethal to babies during birth. There is no cure. It has surpassed syphilis and has been spreading rapidly for some time."  
In the herpes infection of the genitals, itching and sores are followed by patches of red and blisterlike sores. In some cases these patches may progress to relatively large ulcers.

Stark put it this way: "Ours is a student system where the person As it is impossible to do something of our own, that we can not take care of ourselves without coming into contact with the medical system."
