Recognizes faces and voices Can make sounds to get attention

6 Months

Will sit with little support Can roll from tummy to back Imitates sounds made by others First tooth arrives

7 Months

Can move objects
from hand to hand
Seeks dropped

Smiles at self in

crackers or cereal

8 Months

Can stand while holding on, creeps Understands "no" and "bye"

9 Months

Will pull up to stand, crawls

When To Call For Help For Your Baby

CALL YOUR BABY'S DOCTOR OR NURSE IF YOU SEE ANY OF THESE CHANGES:

- Vomits, not just spitting up
- Will not eat
- Sleeps more than usual
- Cries all the time
- Watery stools 3 times daily
- ♦ Feels stiff or is floppy
- ♦ Doesn't seem like himself
- Has trouble breathing. If your baby is having serious difficulty breathing, call 911.
